# Use the following questions and exercises as your group time allows. Feel free to skip one or more questions in each section as necessary. If you have less then thirty minutes for group discussion, we recommend skipping the "Getting Started" section. Be sure to save time for prayer at the end of your meeting, using the "Strength through Prayer" section.

### **Getting Started:**

In this segment, Joe Stowell illustrates a point with a John Wayne World War II movie, The Longest Day, in which the Germans had a practice of moving road signs.

- Have you ever been confused by a sign at an airport or on a street, highway, or trail? Did you end up getting lost?
- Can you recall any other occasion in which you got lost?
- Can you think of a time when you were lost but felt confident you were going in the right direction?

## **Strength through Scripture:**

Open your Bibles to Revelation 22 and have a volunteer read verses 1-7 out loud.

- 1. Why do you think there is not a whole lot in Scripture about the details of what heaven is like?
- 2. Joe states that the thirteenth and final description of heaven, found in Revelation 21:1–22:6, is that we will be identified with the wonderful, liberating person of Jesus Christ for all eternity (see 22:4). How do you feel about having Jesus' name "tattooed" on your forehead?

3. Joe points out that in Revelation 22:7 the apostle John's account of heaver
moves from the place to the promise. Do you really believe and expect that
Jesus could return and take you to heaven at any time—even today?

- 4. Have a member of your group read John 14:1-3 aloud. How do you react to Joe's claim that Jesus' promise is so personal that if you were the only one on this planet to be His, He would be preparing a place for you right now and would come back to get you and take you there?
- 5. Joe states that when you understand not only the wonder of heaven but also the precious promise that God is preparing a place there for you, it should build a passion in your heart that ought to make a dramatic difference in your life. How would you rate the level of that passion in your life?

### **Digging Deeper:**

If your group has enough time (i.e., you've listened to the audio on your own), answer one or more of these optional questions.

- 1. How much can you relate to Joe's statement that when people think of heaven they think about "pearly gates and streets of gold"—concepts that have become trite and of little significance?
- 2. If you had to come up with one word to describe heaven, what would it be?
- 3. How do your attitudes and actions square with Paul's words in Philippians 1:21 and 23, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. . . . I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far"?

## **Strength through Sharing:**

1. Joe states that Satan comes along and moves the sign to heaven and tries to make us think that heaven is in a different direction—like a new house or car, the person you're in love with, a promotion, your bank account, a vacation, or something else on this planet. What bogus "direction" are you tempted to associate with heaven?

2. On the other hand, when the sign is pointed to heaven we keep thinking about doing something for eternity, like writing a check for a missionary who is leading people to Christ. Can you see your life taking on a whole different meaning when the signpost is headed to heaven in terms of your possessions, time, talents, and desires?

#### **Strength through Prayer:**

Spend a few moments as a group in silent, personal prayer. Thank God that Jesus Christ on the cross is our D-day, and that He won the victory and has marshaled us toward heaven. He knows the way; He's got the compass. He's been there before, and He's calling us.

You may want to begin your prayer with these words:

"Heavenly Father, thank You that I can say with the apostle Paul: for me to live is Christ but to die is gain. Going home to be with You would be far better than anything this world has to offer. May the signpost of my heart be pointed toward heaven. May the wonder of the place of heaven and the awe that I am included in the promise of heaven stir a life-changing passion in my heart."

When you are finished with this time for silent, personal prayer, you may want to move into a time of group prayer, praying for one another.

#### **Closing Call to Action:**

Think about all the important things in your life: money, house, relationships, time, energy. If the signpost of your heart is headed toward heaven, how could you use those things differently? How could you use them to make a difference for heaven?

Think about it, and then write it down. Make sure that not only you are on your way to heaven but that the stuff of your life is on the way to heaven too.
